




Demographic records include **all individuals who passed through NDCS custody** during the quarter.


### ADP by Race/Ethnicity



### ADP by Classification - Male




### ADP by Classification - Female

### ADP by Most Serious Offense (MSO)




45% of all NDCS incarcerated individuals are in **minimum security or community facilities**.

The average age is **39** years.

60% of all NDCS incarcerated individuals have an MSO of **Assault, Homicide, Robbery, or Sex Offenses**.

Of the 970 (ADP) individuals past their Parole Eligibility Date (PED), **36%** have previously paroled. Returned parolees **averaged 1.3 attempts** at parole.

## Releases


NDCS community corrections facilities include Community Corrections Center – Omaha (CCC-O) and Community Corrections Center – Lincoln (CCC-L).

*In Q4 of FY25, **338** individuals released spent time at community corrections.*


### Transitions Through Community Corrections Prior to Release by Type

Previously Housed at CCL or CCO 20%





**Recidivism** is calculated based on returns to NDCS custody within three years of an individual's release. For example, a person is considered to have recidivated if they were released in FY2022 and returned any time between then and the end of FY2025.




### 3-Year Recidivism - Totals by Year






### Returns to NDCS Custody - Parole Revocations

## Clinical Treatment Programs




128 individuals are currently enrolled in these 3 clinical treatment programs

**iHeLP** is a residential sexual offense-specific program lasting approximately 12-18 months

**oHeLP** is an outpatient sexual offense-specific program lasting approximately 6 months

**RSU-90** is a residential substance use treatment program lasting approximately 90 days

24% individuals past their PED currently **refuse** treatment

## Clinical Treatment Programs (continued)

### Why is someone enrolled past their PED?

#### Prior Refusal

An individual's participation has been delayed due to personal choice.

#### Prior Attempt

An individual previously attempted a program, but was unsuccessful.

#### Prior Completion

An individual may be re-assigned a program after successful completion due to persisting needs.


#### Updated Needs

An individual was assigned treatment later in their sentence due to institutional misconduct, parole revocations, etc.

#### Sentence Structure

An individual is not housed with NDCS long enough to complete programming.


### Clinical Program Outcomes Past 12 Months

In the last 12 months, **68%** of successful clinical program completions were Pre-PED


### Successful Clinical Program Completions (Last 12 Months)




**74%** of individuals who participated in domestic violence programming successfully completed their program


## Education Programs
