

The Latino Center of the Midlands, formerly known as the Chicano Awareness Center (CAC), was organized in 1971 when several members of Omaha's Chicano community were concerned about the education of Chicano youth. The Adult Basic Education (ABE) Program provides Spanish-speaking adult learners with the following classes:

- Spanish GED (in class instruction and computer-based tutoring)
- Pre-GED skills development in reading, writing and math
- Spanish literacy
- Computer literacy
- English as a Second Language

We believe that by providing a high-quality, basic adult education program to immigrant, Spanish-speaking adults, we are helping them conquer barriers to employment and other goals that affect their quality of life.

- to provide accessible and relevant instruction to the adult basic education student in Spanish,
- to increase the motivation of our students to finish their classes,
- to provide quality instruction in the class, and
- to work collaboratively with other institutions in order to increase the likelihood of personal success for our adult students.
