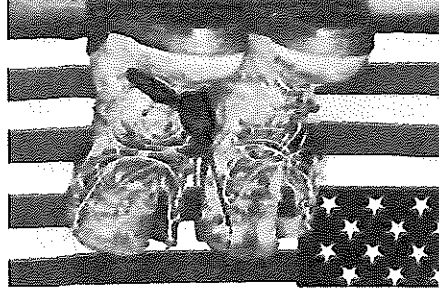

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- To be eligible for SSVF services, you must:
- Be a Veteran, or the member of a family, in which the head of household, or the spouse of the head of household, is a Veteran.
 - Be under SSVF income guidelines
 - Be homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness

What is the definition of a Veteran under the SSVF program?
A person who served in the United States military who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

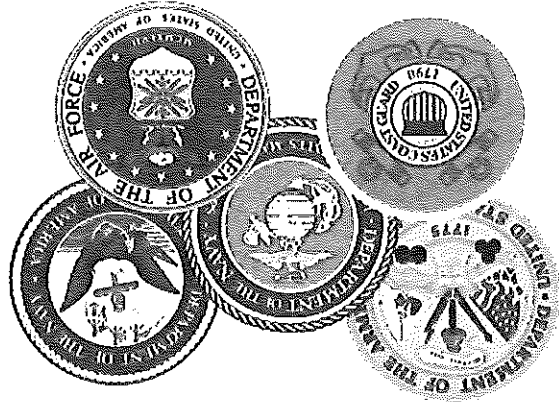
