Why Voices of Hope is Needed

About Sexual Assault...

- A sexual assault occurs in the U.S. once every three minutes.
- One out of every six women and one out of every 33 men will be victims of a sexual assault in her/his lifetime.
- In 84% of all sexual assault cases, there is some degree of acquaintance between the victim and the assailant.
- 68% of sexual assaults are not reported to police.

About Domestic Violence...

- Intimate partner violence accounts for 15% of all violent crimes.
- Women are 90-95% more likely to suffer domestic violence injuries than are men.
- One in four women will experience domestic violence in her lifetime.
- On a typical day, more than 20,000 calls are placed to domestic violence hotlines nationwide.

About Incest/Child Sexual Assault...

- One in three girls and one in seven boys will be sexually assaulted before her/his 18th birthday.
- In 2 out of 3 child sexual assaults, the assailants are immediate family relatives or family friends.

About Stalking...

- 7.5 million people were stalked in one year in the U.S.
- 61% of female victims and 44% of male victims were stalked by a current or former intimate partner.
- An estimated 1 in 6 women and 1 in 17 men have been victims of stalking during their lifetime.
